

OBITUARY OF OWEN RIGGS

THE MILLER COUNTY VIDETTE, Tuscumbia, MO, Thursday October 14, 1875

"Last week we noticed the death of one of our most respected citizens, Owen Riggs. We will now attempt a review of his life. He was born in Tyler Co., West Virginia....."

"His father is still living on the old farm where Owen started in life and is now over 100 years old. We believe he has but <u>one brother living</u>, <u>Edmond Riggs</u>, who is a resident of this county....."

James Riggs³ (Father-Edmund Riggs², Gfather-<u>James Riggs¹</u>) Came to what is now Pleasants Co. West Virginia in 1797 with 2 adult sons (Edmund⁴ & Bazel⁴) & all their families.

Edmund Riggs⁴ (Son of James Riggs³)

- -- Had fifteen children. Three that match ages for Calvin⁵, Owen⁵, & Edmund⁵.
- -- Edmund Riggs⁴ was still alive when Owen⁵ died in Miller Co. as referenced in obit
- -- Edmund Riggs⁴ was the only Riggs of age to be their father who was alive at that time in Pleasants or Tyler Co. West Virginia
- -- Pleasants Co. was created from portion of Tyler Co.
- --The 1827 History of Pleasants Co. W. Virginia reference Edmund Riggs⁴ as having two children, Calvin & Owen who went to Missouri
